WHAT IS THE SU?

The Students' Union is the centre of campus life. It's led by students who are elected by students to represent students!

The SU building has Maggie's Bar & Café downstairs and an office area upstairs. Working with a fabulous staff team, elected students are at the forefront of helping you to have the best experience possible while studying at QMU.

The SU works in a range of areas: Representation, Student Support (The HelpZone), Events, Communications, and Sports & Societies. The student officer roles give you a chance to be involved in the areas that interest you.

The number 1 priority of the Students' Union is to ensure that student views are heard in as many ways and places as possible. We aim to make sure that every student at QMU is represented but we can only do that with support from our students.

WHAT IS THE OFFICER COMMITTEE?

The SU Officer Committee is made up of 10 elected student representatives. They are responsible for much of the running of the SU. Each Officer has their own remit. Collectively, they are responsible for making sure that the SU is student-focused and responds to the needs of the students.

The President - Academic Life, President - Student Activities and one Part-time Officer are members of the Board of Trustees. As the SU is a registered charity, the Trustee Board ensures it is legally compliant in all areas. Student officers who join the Trustee Board therefore take on extra responsibilities.





Voting Guide

HOW TO VOTE

The Students' Union uses the Single Transferrable Vote (STV) system which ensures that all elected officers have a majority share of the vote. It's fairly straightforward, you just number your candidates from the ones you like the best to least!

Basically you rank candidates in order of preference. To give your preference, all you need to do is to tap on your first choice candidate and then tap again on your second choice and so on until you run out of candidates. You don't need to tap on all candidates to give them a vote if you don't want to. If you make a mistake or want to change the order of preference, you can use the Clear button and start again. Once you're happy, you need to click the Submit Ballot button to submit your vote.

This means that if your first preference receives the least number of votes, they are dismissed and your second preference is counted until a candidate achieves at least 51% of the vote.

Re-open nominations is an option in every election. Re-open nominations means you think we should re-open Nominations and is there to ensure that there is always a second choice. Vote re-open nominations if you don't think any of the candidates are up to scratch and would rather that a by-election be called. By-elections would take place in October.
